

PageExpress 2005 Messaging Client Software for CCG

Introduction

PageExpress 2005 is a Windows based software for alphanumeric paging/SMS Messaging. It works in conjunction with CCG in a Client -Server architecture to send messages to CCG for paging.

Features

Windows based

A very user-friendly and popular Operating System, it provides the advantages of being easy to use and having a broad user base. Supports Win95 and above.

SMS, Alpha-Numeric and Numeric

The system supports SMS, Message and Numeric Paging, thus giving the user more flexibility in using the software for his applications (depending on the configuration of the CCG).

Acknowledgements

Messages can be triggered to a recipient whereby the recipient has to send back a message to the system for acknowledgement. This provides a closed loop whereby the sender is assured that the message has been

read and acted upon. The system is able to send repeated messages for unacknowledged messages'

Pre-defined Messages

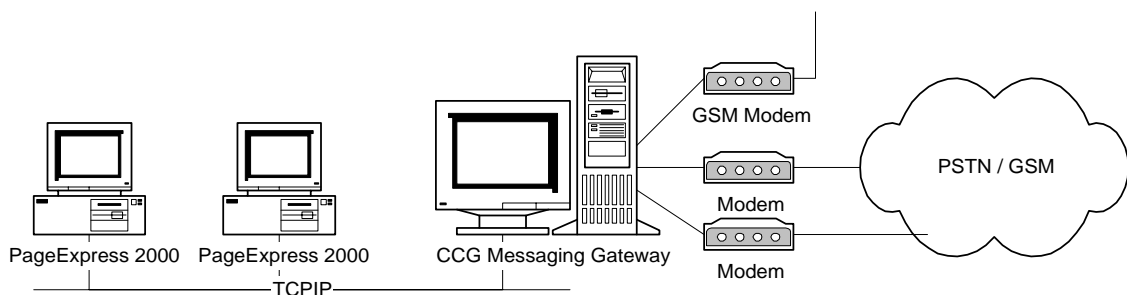
Common messages that are frequently sent can be stored into a message file.

Group paging

Having group paging, which allows the user to create a group name and assign individual pagers to the group, increases productivity by cutting down on manual paging individual pagers in the group. The group can be prioritized according to paging order.

Audit trailing of all messages

The audit trail provides the user a history of all the messages and pager numbers that has been paged.



System Requirement

- Pentium III PC min. 256MB RAM and 1GB hard disk space.
- Win95/98/XP/2000/2003
- CCG Gateway.

Interconnectivity

The PageExpress software communicates with the CCG messaging gateway via TCPIP, using socket port 5050 and 5051.

There is no limit to the number of PageExpress which the CCG can support, as the PageExpress will only establish a socket connection for a split second when it needs to deposit the paging job into the CCG.
